
VAS ART SPOTLIGHT

*FEATURED ARTIST THIS MONTH IS *Jacqui Miller**

My artistic practice began in childhood, shaped first by my love for horses and then by my exposure to the Vietnam War. The moment I encountered Nick Ut's photograph of the young girl fleeing the bombing, my work shifted from beauty to advocacy. Even at nine, I understood that images can carry moral force—that art can confront, witness, and demand response. Over the years, my creative life intertwined with a long professional career in the

equestrian world and a parallel path in design and communication. These disciplines trained me to observe closely, to understand emotion in form, and to appreciate how visual language shapes perception. After retiring from the horse industry, I returned fully to art, only to find an oversaturated visual landscape. This challenged me to ask essential questions: Why contribute more images to



a world teeming with them? What is my voice? What is the purpose? The answer lies in my earliest motivations. I am drawn to art that provokes thought, challenges assumptions, and opens space for empathy. My work engages themes of injustice, resilience, and the human cost of political and social systems. I often use found materials and symbolic forms, transforming the familiar into commentary. My practice is still evolving, but its intention is clear: to create imagery that compels the viewer to pause, question, and feel—and perhaps to see the world, and their place within it, a little differently.

His photograph, “Mystery Valley Rainstorm,” taken in Mystery Valley, Arizona, also won a Silver Award in that competition. The Epson International Pano Award Competition is the world’s largest competition devoted to the art and craft of panoramic photography. Silver Awards are given to pictures in the top 10% of the judging. Over 1600 photographs were entered in the 2025 competition.

Add the Aggieland Art Trail App to your Phone

1. Go to aggielandarttrail.app
 2. Sign Up (it's free)
 3. Checkout, add your info and complete the order
 4. You will receive the link to your mobile pass in the email.
 5. Once you are logged into your pass in Chrome on your Android phone and you want to make it an app on your phone, you must be in Chrome browser. You can follow the directions given in FAQs in the top banner.
 - If you see the 3 dots on the top right side of your screen, proceed directly to Step 8.
 6. Hold your finger on the 3 horizontal bars at the bottom right on your screen (don't click, hold). Up pops the Chrome info.
 7. Pick Open in Chrome Browser
 8. tap the 3 dots in the top right corner and look for "Add to Home screen"
 9. The app will be installed.
- Note that you win awards for visiting the art featured on the Aggieland Art Trail by accumulating points! !


Fall Plein Air Painting

VAS member, Joel Kitchens has published a book



Great news—Joel Kitchens has finished his book! It will be available for purchase this December, but you can preorder now through TAMU Press.

[San Antonio and Its Missions. Three Centuries of History, Memory, and Heritage By Joel Daniel Kitchens.](#) This book claims San Antonio's five Spanish Colonial-era missions are "sites of memory," as defined by French historian Pierre Nora. By that definition, the missions are an enduring, and deeply-rooted part of the city's heritage. As both sacred spaces, as well as being some of the top tourist attractions in the state, the missions continue to serve some of the original religious and educational functions that began three centuries ago on what was then a remote site on the frontier. In 2015, the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization recognized the missions' importance to Texas and beyond by awarding World Heritage Site status to these buildings. By taking a

'deep dive' into the primary sources, this project explores how and why the Spanish built the missions, what happened to the missions after the Spanish colonizers left, and how and why the missions came to weigh so heavily in the American imagination and identity (particularly after the 1836 Battle of the Alamo, and the arrival of the railroad in 1877 which connected San Antonio to the national web of iron and steel), even into the twenty-first century. The primary sources include Spanish Colonial documents, census data, travel narratives, advertisements by railroad companies, tourist guides, and even the buildings themselves.
